I wanted to have a name related to those islands. "Ha" means "fabric." "Bu" means "wave." "Bu" means "fabric." "We chose a different character for "ha" for our name, which means "no. 8." Because of its bottom wide shape, this number is believed to bring a life, which will slowly, but eventually opens up for you.
